City school gets certificate for quality education

JAIN International Residential School became the first school in Karnataka and the tenth in the country to be awarded the accreditation certificate for Quality School Governance from the National Accreditation Board for Education and Training (NABET).

A press release issued by the school said accreditation certificate was presented to Dr R Chenraj Jain, chairman of the JGI Group and Dr Girdhar J Gyani, secretary general of Quality Council of India, Jain Heritage School Campus.

The certificate is valid for four years.

Such an accreditation is awarded to schools that meet standards set for quality education by the Quality Council of

India (QCI).

The schools are assessed by the board on 50 parameters, including governance, educational and support processes, curriculum, examination and assessments, financial resources, infrastructure, health, safety and many other norms before accreditation is granted.

The NABET team visited Jain International Residential School on February 13, 2010, and conducted a diagnostic test that included the school's affiliations, policy documents, processes set up, fee payment mechanism, faculty development programmes, student development initiatives, safety and health measures and interacted with all the stakeholders, assessed the school's position and also identified areas that need improvement, the press release said.
